

FOOD TRUCK PLANET SYNOPSIS

ACT I

The world has ended.

Not in a single cataclysm, but through years of war, famine, and collapse. Along the forgotten highways of America, food trucks have become the last surviving kingdoms of civilization. Every truck protects its own recipes, traditions, and territory while rival clans battle for fuel, survival, and hope.

Outside the ruins of Chicago, the feared warlord **Mad Maxine Jones** and her motorcycle army, **the Butchies**, celebrate another brutal victory as Maxine leads her followers in "**All For One**," proclaiming that loyalty and strength—not mercy—are now the only laws of the wasteland. Once a woman of deep faith, Maxine has abandoned compassion, convinced that only power can survive in a broken world.

Unseen by mortals, Maxine's bitterness is quietly nurtured by **Mr. Lucky**, the charming embodiment of Lucifer, who revels in mankind's weakness during "**Bad Boy Shuffle**." Opposing him is **Cain**, a mysterious wanderer who is, in truth, the Archangel Michael. Through "**Salvation Road**," Cain offers a quiet reminder that another path still exists for those willing to choose hope over despair.

Far from these supernatural forces, veteran food truck owner **Sonny El Santo** and his determined daughter **Maria** prepare to abandon the shattered city they once called home. Maria believes that surviving without hope is merely another form of dying, while Sonny fears the road will claim the only family he has left. As father and daughter finally choose to leave Chicago in search of the legendary **Fountains of Youth**, they affirm their decision in "**Leaving Chicago**," embracing the uncertain future together.

ACT II
